## REMARKS.

—:0:—

BALANCE SHEET No. 1, is a statement of the sums received from collections in the Mission Chapel and other sources, and of the manner in which the money so obtained has been expended. Two collections are made yearly in the Chapels at Singapore and Jurong for the St. Andrew's Church Mission, on Advent and Whitsunday, which are paid to H. G. Millar Esqr., Honorary Treasurer. In the yearly Report of the Cathedral will be found a statement, from the Treasurer, of the St. Andrew's Cathedral Mission funds. The money in my hands is spent in rendering pecuniary aid to the sick and needy, in defraying the expenses connected with the Chapels, and helping towards the funeral expenses of poor Christians. I must record my thankfulness to the members of the congregation for the liberal manner in which they have contributed towards these objects, by which a larger balance has been left unexpended in my hands at the end of the year than that with which I started at the commencement.

BALANCE SHEET No. 2, is the account of the Bequest Fund invested in the Savings Bank. This has been in-

creased, during the year, by a sum of \$10.00 from the estate of Lim Ah Sam deceased. The INTEREST of this money will be paid yearly to the Honorary Treasurer for the expenses of the Mission. It is intended to call this Fund in future, "The Endowment Fund," so as to include, besides bequests, donations from those, who may desire the interest only, accruing from their contributions to be used.
