## *Nineteenth Century Pamphlets at Pusey House*

OVER the past fifty or sixty years Pusey House, Oxford, has gradually come into possession of some twenty-four thousand pamphlets from the nineteenth century. The purpose of the following monograph is to show how they have been indexed so as to be an easily-worked source of material for the student.

Something must first be said, however, on the nature and value of pamphlet collections, and on the Pusey House collection in particular. Ordinarily, collections of pamphlets have suffered neglect, either by reason of the daunting quantity of a properly representative collection or because of the inevitably incomplete character of a small one. The Pusey House collection is sufficiently large to be reasonably representative of Church affairs throughout the whole period of the nineteenth century; and because it is composed of five or six major and several minor collections, it is saved from the limitation of reflecting only one man's interests and prejudices. Fortunately, too, the original makers of the major collections were men of wide interests, so that the material they preserved turns out to be extremely diverse and therefore valuable to students not directly interested in Church affairs. The indexes now make it possible for a student to approach the material from several different directions, so that it is no longer a counsel of perfection to say that no one studying the nineteenth century can afford to neglect the pamphlet.

The value of controversial pamphlets does not lie only or even chiefly in the means they provide for checking matters of fact. It is probable that much of what they afford in this way has already been extracted and put into full-scale reviews of the period. Their peculiar value resides in their being a type of material standing between the historical review on the one hand and daily newspapers and private letters on the other. Although, like letter or newspaper, they are for the most part written to deal with urgent and passing phases, they are more concerned than either to provide a perspective. But, in contrast with the

historical review, their perspective is a short one. Herein lies their value to the student. They allow him to feel the changing climate of controversy and even the atmosphere of tension induced by coming events. They faithfully reflect both the disappointments and frustrations of the previous months, and the hopes and fears for the coming weeks. Nothing else quite allows him to experience the progress of events as they were understood at the time.

Compared with articles in periodicals, pamphlets again have their own particular character—an independence which the others may lack. For it has to be remembered that many of the pamphlets were never intended to be economic propositions. They were sent out subsidized by their authors and could afford, from that point of view, to ignore public opinion in a way that no editor of a periodical could allow for long in articles he commissioned or was asked to publish.

More detailed consideration of the value and use of this particular collection of pamphlets follows in due course. At this point, however, mention must be made of two other collections of material in Pusey House, the manuscript letters and the periodicals. The letters and pamphlets naturally support each other; while the periodical, after running alongside the pamphlet for some time, eventually displaces it as a medium for controversy.

The nucleus of the collection of *letters* is some hundred and twenty volumes of original letters and transcripts put together by H. P. Liddon for his *Life of E. B. Pusey*. To this was added a large number of letters and papers by, or relating to, Cardinal Newman. A further addition was the collection made by S. L. Ollard and others, until the present whole contains something of importance concerning most of the notable ecclesiastical figures of the nineteenth century. These papers have now been sorted and grouped, and are provided with an index under the names of the author and, sometimes, the recipient also.

Nineteenth century church *periodicals* include the *British Critic*, *British Magazine*, *Christian Remembrancer*, *Guardian*, and others.

With a view to putting this material at the easy disposal of the student, pamphlets and manuscripts, but not periodicals, have been housed in a single room devoted to them alone. The

pamphlets, with which this monograph will be solely concerned from now on, are arranged on open shelves, either in the sets of volumes into which their original collectors gathered and bound them, or, where loose, newly stored in boxes according to their date of publication. Further, since these bound volumes are not a single collection but, as has been said, comprise the collections of various more or less well-known men, the whole of each sub-collection has been preserved, and also restored as near as could be to the order in which the collector had once arranged them. This causes some inevitable overlapping and duplication between sub-collections, but that slight disadvantage has been ignored for sake of the consideration that each markedly individual sub-library reflects the character of its maker and deserves to be preserved entire as good biographical material.

#### THE SUB-COLLECTIONS

##### *G. A. Denison*

The first sub-collection is that of Archdeacon Denison. It consists of eighty-six volumes holding 2,500 pamphlets which are fairly evenly distributed over the period 1830–87. They faithfully reveal Denison's interests: Oxford University affairs; education, particularly the threat to church schools inherent in the Manchester and Salford scheme; the revival and activities of Convocation, of which he became prolocutor in the Lower House of Canterbury; and—as befits an archdeacon—the causes of orthodoxy and administrative church reform.

An indication of the possible value of a collection of pamphlets to a biographer may perhaps be had from the following. First, in all Denison's large collection of material relating to Oxford and the tractarian movement from 1830 onwards, there is only to be found one small example of the writings of Newman—the trivial 'selection' put out in 1874. It is Denison alone who has made a deliberate effort to preserve material from undergraduate days in Oxford. It is he alone who has preserved any of the voluminous Hoare correspondence on the revival of Convocation, and he has preserved the whole of it, even to the extent of keeping proofs. It is he who has collected the greatest number of simply odd and out of the way pamphlets, from a dissertation

on Cheddar cheese to the use of mesmerism in the removal of a thigh without the knowledge of the patient. Even the binding of his volumes seem to provide a clue for a biographer, for it is noticeable that until 1856, Denison, like the others, bound his collection in good calf, but thereafter descended to cloth and boards—silently and unwillingly witnessing, one supposes, to the cost of his stand in the actions brought against him.

*William Ince, Tom Keble, R. Jenkyns*

Three small groups follow Denison's. Three hundred from between the years 1864 and 1900, in eleven volumes put together by a sometime regius professor of Divinity in Oxford, William Ince; a broken set of nine volumes belonging to Tom, the nephew of John, Keble; and a further nine volumes made up by R. Jenkyns, Master of Balliol and Dean of Wells. These last two together total three hundred extremely miscellaneous pamphlets from between 1820 and 1875.

*R. W. Church*

Dean Church's big and varied collection occupies 146 volumes and totals about 2,000 pamphlets. He was naturally concerned in the church controversies of the day, but his material reflects an interest in almost everything, except what he himself wrote. His pamphlets range over literature, art, philosophy, philology, science, archæology, education, reunion, Oxford University and Irish Church affairs. He even troubled to bind up seven volumes of booksellers' catalogues, which make an interesting source of information on current reading of the time at home and abroad. Through his connection with Asa Gray he has a number of early American scientific papers, especially on Darwinism and the American reaction to it. His collection reaches from 1820 to 1885. Something of the man himself appears, not only in his refusal to preserve his own writings, but in the methodical way in which he has grouped the material by subject and to some extent by date, as also in his habit of making marginal notes and of preserving the covering letters of those who sent him their works.

*W. Hayward Cox*

Denison and Church were both tractarian in sympathy. So likewise were many of the other chief contributors to the Pusey House collection. It is fortunate that there are two large sub-collections from other than tractarian sources; and more fortunate still that these two complement each other. The first of them consists of the fourteen hundred methodically arranged pamphlets of W. Hayward Cox, sometime vice-principal of S. Mary Hall at Oxford. An Oxford man, deeply engaged in all the controversies there during the middle years of the century, he has grouped his collection round the names of the chief figures or the important questions of the day: thirteen volumes for Newman, three for Gorham, six for Hampden, two each for Colenso and W. G. Ward, one each for Denison and W. J. E. Bennett; after that, he has Ritualism, ten volumes; Church and State, eight; Athanasian Creed and Confession, three each; Eucharist, two; and Rationalism, Religious Orders, Marriage, Synods, Convocation, Jerusalem Bishopric, and Prayer Book Revision, one each. One particular merit of this collection is the assortment of newscuttings pasted in as an appendix to each of the volumes.

A small collection dealing with Romanism and Reunion follow but, apart from two volumes from W. J. Copeland's library, their source is not known.

*Charles Lindley Wood, Second Viscount Halifax*

The next thousand pamphlets, covering the period 1855 to 1909, were collected by Lord Halifax, and carefully bound up according to their subjects: European affairs, Reunion, and the English Church Union are rather naturally their chief concern.

*E. M. Ingram*

Edward Mason Ingram was a vice-president of the Church of England Working Men's Society. His eight hundred pamphlets are mostly connected with his interests in social work and church life in London parishes, between 1855 and 1909. In his sub-collection and in the two that follow his are to be found a good many parish and mission tracts, along with service papers and other similar ephemera.

*George Cowell, H. L. Rumsey, J. B. Mozley*

These three small collections, of four volumes each, add another 300 pamphlets. Of these the last fifty, collected by a regius professor of Divinity at Oxford, are valuable for their being mostly concerned with Oxford in the 'thirties, when the pamphlet war was about to begin in earnest.

*A. J. Stephens, Q.C.*

The second large collection by a non-tractarian, which, as was said, complements that of Hayward Cox, consists of nineteen hundred pamphlets bound in sixty-five large leather-bound volumes, and was put together by A. J. Stephens. He and his collection remain somewhat of an enigma. He is a layman and a lawyer. Disputes are his meat, and by preference church disputes. Yet he seems largely unconcerned with the centre of the great church controversy. Oxford he ignores. And although he has made a useful collection of material from Church Association sources, he seems not to have bothered to study the views of the English Church Union. Ordinary church life seems to have held no interest for him. Even such pressing questions as Church Extension, Missions, and the never-ending matter of the Deceased Wife's Sister failed to find their way into his collection. Pious tracts on the Christian life, as one might expect, he passes by, only to make a surprising and fairly substantial collection of the bitterer sort of ultra-protestant tract. Altogether it is the fringe of everything that seems to attract him, so that his pamphlets reflect the controversies in Ireland and Scotland, and even in Australia, rather than in England. Even his volumes are a puzzle. Thus, the terminal date in each volume advances steadily, but the date of the earliest pamphlet seems fortuitous; as if at each year's end he merely gathered up and bound whatever pamphlets lay under his hand. Few of the volumes show more care than this in their assembly. And yet he went to the trouble of indexing each of them three times.

*Arthur Brinckman*

After Stephens the inner unity of each sub-collection deteriorates, and the last two hundred of the bound volumes are a

medley of broken sets, pairs and single volumes. Arthur Brinckman's collection is the last to have any unity, and even that is somewhat accidental, for he does not seem to have bound many pamphlets of his own collecting but to have bought groups of volumes second-hand. His collection of twelve hundred are made up of at least six smaller collections, each of which has been defaced by his peculiarly ugly scrawl, and often mutilated where he has cut out title pages and paragraphs for ammunition in his running fight with Romanism. His other special interests seem to have included church work among prostitutes—he was chairman to the Church Mission to the Fallen—and the plight of Cashmere.

*Church House Library, English Church Union Library and others*

The remaining 3,500 pamphlets in bound volumes come mostly from the Church House and the English Church Union libraries and have no inherent unity at all. But they cover the whole century and import a good many new interests. Of particular note are early tracts on Catholic Emancipation, political broadsheets from Leeds in the 'twenties, medical pamphlets and quantities of parish tracts.

*Boxed Collection: E. B. Pusey, W. J. Copeland, William Bright, W. Inge and others*

The 4,000 boxed pamphlets are particularly heterogeneous. They seem in the main to have come from four sources: E. B. Pusey, W. J. Copeland, William Bright and W. Inge, the father of Dean Inge. Some four hundred and fifty are from the first forty years of the century; another three hundred from the continent, along with a hundred from North America. Two hundred odd are bishops' or archdeacons' charges. The rest are more or less evenly spread among the topics already covered by those in the bound volumes. In general it can be said, however, that these loose pamphlets tend to be substantial ones, no doubt because the single leaf is apt to be torn up or lost. The exception to this is the collection made by W. Inge, who seems painstakingly to have

collected and preserved a good deal of ephemeral matter, both parochial and educational. Moreover, much as Denison imported a local flavour into his collection by including pamphlets from the south-west, so also does Inge with others from the Northern Province and the north-east.

In the bound volumes there is some unavoidable duplication, but in this boxed collection all duplicates have been removed.

#### THE COLLECTION AS A WHOLE

##### Statistics

Of the original 24,000 some 2,500 were disposed of as duplicates. A further 3,000 duplicates remain among the bound volumes, noted but not catalogued. The balance of 18,500 are the fully catalogued collection intended for the use of the student. Of these we have so far described their collectors, and given some indication of each man's particular interests outside those main lines of controversy which are common to all collectors: Church and State, Baptism, Eucharist, Subscription, and the various cross-currents in the wrangle between or within the Roman Catholic, Anglican and Free Churches. Some further idea of the scope of the collection can be had from the following facts. About 5,000 authors are concerned, along with 1,000 who go under pseudonym or anonym. Five hundred corporate bodies of various sorts are listed as author or sponsor of one or more pamphlets. Bishops' and archdeacons' charges number more than six hundred, and there are seven hundred separately indexed newscuttings from provincial as well as national journals.

The topics covered by the collection are too many to list and too various to summarize, but some idea of the variety can be got from the headings of the subject index, provided it is realized that these have been rather artificially limited to three hundred.

The headings of the subject index and the names of all who figure in the index of authors are set out in the appendices to this monograph, along with a note of the number of pamphlets under the heading or name, so that some estimate can be made of the quantity of material available to a prospective student.

#### INDEXING

##### General

The main index system is fourfold and consists of an index of authors, an index of titles, a complete handlist of titles, and a subject index. There are also various subsidiary indexes which will be mentioned below, and the beginning of a small reference library containing those works which are often referred to in the pamphlets. All these indexes and the reference library interlock in various ways, with the object of allowing the student quickly to isolate his own interest and as quickly to record from the index exactly the material he wishes to investigate on the shelves. In its being fourfold, the system permits several avenues of approach to the material. In general, it may be said to allow a user to isolate either a single pamphlet, or one general subject, or the pamphlets by or to a particular author, or those related to a particular controversy, or those published within a given span of years, or some combination of these.

##### Reference system and shelving

For lack of any inherent unity in the material, the simplest possible reference system was chosen to *locate* and *identify* each pamphlet. The volumes of each sub-collection were arranged on the shelves, as has been said, in an order as near as could be to the original owner's, and the sub-collections themselves put in succession, beginning with Denison's, in the order in which they are mentioned above. Then each pamphlet was numbered serially, the numbering of each volume's contents beginning where its predecessor's left off. The reference number was stamped on the top right hand corners of the first two pages. Thus this number identifies merely one copy of any one pamphlet: duplicates will have another number according to their position within the collection.

Because the collection consists of bound volumes together with boxes of loose pamphlets, and because further accessions of both loose and bound pamphlets may be expected, two starting points for serial numbers had to be arranged. Thus, at the time of writing, the serials of the bound pamphlets run from 1-14280 odd, and of the boxed from 70001-74260 odd.

Each volume (or box) is also numbered serially, and on its spine will be found information tabulated as shown below:

Line (a) records the first and last serial in the volume or box concerned. Line (b) is the number of the *volumè* (or *box*). Line (c) gives the bracket of years between which the pamphlets' dates of publication fall.

This information is sufficient to allow one to browse along the shelves for pamphlets of a given date, but its real purpose is to serve the four main indexes described below.

### Index of Titles

The first of these is the index of titles. It is a simple index of 16,000 cards arranged alphabetically according to the title of each pamphlet as it stands typed on the face of the card. Cards belonging to duplicates have been extracted from the index, but the serial numbers of such duplicates have been pencilled on the face of the card that remains. The serial number of the pamphlet to which the card refers appears at the top left hand corner of the typed title, thus:

The uses of this index are: to locate in this collection a copy of a pamphlet whose title is accurately known from elsewhere (by means of the serial typed on the card); to verify if this collection has any other editions of the same pamphlet (the neighbouring cards will be those of the other editions if they exist); and to locate duplicates.

### Index of Authors

The index of authors is also a card index. Each author has his card, filed alphabetically, on which are stamped the serial numbers of the pamphlets: on the face of the card are the serial numbers of those pamphlets of which he is the author or sponsor, or those in which a speech of his is reported or a work of his reviewed *in extenso*; on the reverse of the card are stamped the

serial numbers of any pamphlets addressed to him or mentioning him in their title. As a result, the card of any author whose name is attached to a particular controversy, e.g. Gorham or Colenso, will, if the back and front are considered together, provide a kind of index to that controversy.

This index of authors is divided into four: General; Pseudonyms and Anonyms; Corporate Bodies; Journals and Periodicals. Such subdivision is intended to allow the student either to ignore the latter three minor indexes, or else to skim one of them quickly. The advantage of a small sub-index is especially apparent in the matter of Corporate Bodies whose names are so unpredictable, undergo so many changes, and are so often misquoted. The four subdivisions are adhered to in the appendices at the end of this monograph.

The general section of the index has a few peculiarities to be noticed by the user. Most of the entries are the names of individuals arranged alphabetically under their surnames, and their initials or Christian names. Some few remain hidden under their initials alone, or under their appointments. Bishops are all listed under their sees, and peers under their titles, once they have assumed their rank. In looking for material by or relating to A. C. Tait, one should therefore search under TAIT, Revd. Archibald Campbell; LONDON, Bishop of; and CANTERBURY, Archbishop of. It would also be worth checking for material under the initials A.C.T., and under the appointment, CARLISLE, Dean of. A reference to the section, Pseudonyms and Anonyms, would of course be necessary if he was known to have adopted any.

This multiplicity of reference and apparent confusion has been forced upon the system by the nature of the material. The various authors are not careful to identify themselves exactly upon each occasion, and therefore it seemed wiser for the cataloguer to record the material in the way in which it was presented rather than to attempt a rationalization. Users must recognize that one author's card may contain the output of two different men by the same name. Equally, the output of one man may well appear on two cards, if he chooses, as some do, to refer to himself in different ways.

*Subject Index*

The subject index consists of some three hundred folios arranged in a loose-leaf binder so that the subject headings can be quickly scanned. The index does not claim to be exhaustive. A folio is allotted to each of the chosen headings, but no doubt the entries under any one heading could often be redistributed. The existing headings are to be accepted as pointers. They indicate the approximate quantity of material and locate the greater proportion of it. But perhaps it is in the negative aspect of the headings that their chief value lies, in that they tell a would-be user which of the 18,500 pamphlets are no concern of his.

Certain pamphlets have knowingly not been fully indexed, either for lack of time to read them or for lack of knowledge on the part of the cataloguer. But so that others can see at a glance what has not been dealt with, the unindexed have been entered under the general heading, 'Limbo.' There they must lie until some scholar comes to redeem them to a more useful existence. Because of their wide reference, most bishops' and archdeacons' charges are in Limbo. But any one interested in the charges of a particular man or period can soon locate them as described below.

As with the authors index, the entries in the subject index are simply entries of the serial number. With either index it is necessary to turn to the hand list or the relevant volume to find the title of the pamphlet noted.

*Hand List*

The final main division of the index system is the Hand List. It is the heart of the system and consists of seven large ledger-like volumes into which has been entered in strict serial order the title of each pamphlet, i.e., a copy of the entry on the title-index card. In the spare columns opposite the title is put all the other information available about the pamphlet, i.e. its volume or box number, its other editions, any sequels or replies that may have followed it, any key pamphlet which may have served to initiate it, its connection—if any—with the reference section, and, when it is a duplicate, a notice to this effect with a record of the serial number of the 'original.'

The uses of the hand list are several. First, the student may settle down and read through all seven volumes and gather his material in that way, jotting down as he goes the serial numbers of those titles that interest him and noting cross-references and so on, before he eventually turns to the shelves. It will take him a week. Otherwise, if he is content to reduce his search, he can go straight to the subject index or the authors index, and from chosen card or folio turn up the titles of the relevant serials in the hand list. By scanning the titles, he can reject those that do not concern him, note the ones that do, and only then need he take the trouble to go to the shelves. By this method a few hundred references can be gone through in an hour.

*Subsidiary Indexes*

There are five subsidiary indexes: Newscuttings; Annotations, manuscript letters and marginalia; Bishops' and archdeacons' charges; Hand list of authors; and a Contents list within each bound volume.

The index of newscuttings already mentioned is simply an annexe to the index of titles, made by sifting out the newscuttings. Each card records the opening words of the newscutting, its source, date and author, if known, and a note of the length in inches of the column of newsprint. As before, the newscutting itself can be located through the serial typed on the card.

The manuscript annotations and letters found among the pamphlets being unique and hitherto unnoticed material, have been noted and recorded in a small index of some three hundred and fifty entries, which has been added as a supplement to the authors index. Cards have been made out for each author of a note or letter and where appropriate for each recipient.

The index of bishops' and archdeacons' charges records one copy of any charge existing among the pamphlets (other editions, if any, must be located in the usual way through the title index or the hand list). These charges are grouped by sees and according to their date, in such a way that it is possible to see at a glance the output of any one see or any one year from 1800-1910. A number of charges are from Irish, Scottish and overseas dioceses, but the bulk are from the province of Canterbury. Altogether, in the 616 noted, there seem to be enough to form the basis for

a worthwhile study of this now all but disused instrument of church government and instruction.

The hand list of authors is merely a replica of the appendices in this monograph, but, like them, it can be used to scan the material available in the authors index without the trouble of picking a way through the 6,000 separate cards.

The contents list is merely a copy of the hand list entries for one volume, pasted into the front of the volume concerned.

#### *Working Instructions, etc.*

The first four volumes of the pamphlet hand list contain working instructions and a few preliminary remarks on the planning of the index system. In Pusey House there are also records of the time, quantity and costs of making such an index system.

#### POSSIBLE USES OF THE PAMPHLET COLLECTION

##### *Church History*

Any student whose work is at all concerned with ecclesiastical history or church controversies in the nineteenth century will always find something of value in the pamphlets. The indexing has been arranged particularly with his needs in view. Such obvious use we shall assume, and turn to consider uses less self-evident.

##### *English Social History*

The collection is above all a mine for the social historian. The best material does not lie on the surface, but must be dug for. In this instance a student will probably have to read carefully through the hand list—not for lack of material but for fear of missing something valuable. Unexpected gems appear continually—prize essays on the corn laws, cottage improvement schemes, provident society rules, coal and clothing clubs, workingmen's colleges, the country antiquary's notes, village library rules, country-town philosophical society papers, electioneering broadsheets and other kinds of social hysteria, services for days of special observance, methods material and spiritual for dealing with the cattle plague, debates about the prevention of juvenile prostitution, reactions to the census, and to the contagious

diseases acts, new ways of decorating walls and of arming men-of-war, the art of rejuvenating universities, lottery tickets with a list of agreeable prizes, pensions, pawnbroking, nursing, farewells in verse, obituaries, horrors, marvels, Maria Marten, Irvingism, lampoons, anti-vivisection and Skibbereen.

But to list these, and even to examine, weigh and order them all, is in some sense to skate over the surface. One effect of scanning the whole collection is to be made slowly aware of some quite other activity steadily continuing beneath the surface flux which first forces itself on the attention. This underlying activity is essentially a social one, and of more lasting interest than the details through which it has happened to manifest itself. This welter of pamphlets is itself a huge social event, which deserves to be investigated simply for its own sake. It is a vast attempt to communicate, comparable to the present century's radio and television, but quite different. Not only its method is different, but its manner—or, better, say its manners. What those manners are it is important to grasp, and yet impossible without such a mass of material as the present. But some idea can be gained of the difference in method and manner simply by savouring the titles of a few of the pamphlets and by noticing the precise words chosen in, for example, these: 'Remarks on the advantage of loan funds . . . for the poor and industrious,' 'Account of the great landslip and extraordinary convulsions of the coast . . . 'A pastor's chamber sermon: or, a few words to the Poor about going to Church,' 'A solemn cry on Church Rates,' 'The Prayer Book a safeguard against religious excitement,' 'God's view of our Babylon in slaying Alford, beginner of the Bible Revision,' and 'On Logomachy and the duty of building Churches.'

Even the steady change in the outward form of the pamphlet marks some significant alteration in English social life during the century. Type faces grow clearer but a grace goes from them round about 1830. About the same time or a few years later the paper becomes finer, and more even in quality from pamphlet to pamphlet. Edges are guillotined. Titles tend to shorten. Little further change occurs in the middle years of the century, but after Pusey's death in 1882 a sort of malaise descends on the pamphlet. It begins to deck itself out in coloured covers filled with decoration and artistic type faces. The paper is often

artificially bulked. Bad reproductions of photographs appear. It is the last effort before the printing houses succumb to the challenge of the press. When once the intellectual controversy had spent itself it seems to have sunk into a sort of subterranean existence in the pages of periodicals and journals. For nearly a century, however, the pamphlet, along with its allies, the catechism, the tract, and the open letter, held its own as a means to the popularization of ideas, and they deserve to be studied on their own merits as a social fact.

#### *Subsidiary uses of the collection*

Other lines of investigation, in which the pamphlets would have a useful but humbler part to play, would be, first, in the preparation of histories.

#### *Histories*

There is material to support the history of education, of missions, of science, of colonial affairs and organization, of English foreign affairs, and of church reform.

#### *Biblical Exegesis*

Most of the questions raised in the nineteenth century controversies, if they did not turn directly upon biblical exegesis, were often the cause of an excursion into that field. The amount of material towards a history of recent exegesis, especially in its popular aspect and in its practical application, is enormous. In some ways, too, the end of the pamphlet era, mentioned above, coincides with the end of an era in biblical exegesis. In the nineteenth century the two can hardly be studied apart.

#### *English Literature*

The student of English literature will find some excellent fields in the prize essays, in the generous supply of bad verse, and in the somewhat polished juvenilia of great men. Every sub-collection also contains as a normal ingredient a fair quantity of squibs, skits and satires. There are more than a hundred and thirty of these curiosities—adequate material for an anthology of nineteenth century ecclesiastical or university wit.

Of greater importance to the student, however, is the pamphlet form itself. It is a true literary form, distinct though varying. Some of the writers brought it to a fine art. And though many of the pamphlets were dashed off in haste, many more were composed with a loving care. There are copy-book examples of every literary style—even the best.

#### *Biography, etc.*

No doubt in general it will be for the sake of certain individuals that the pamphlets will most often be consulted; and those individuals will be the well-known figures. But it may be worth observing that it is only when some large collection is sorted and indexed that the relative importance of certain names is seen. Some of the writers now forgotten were the authorities in the parish library and pulpit of their day. It was their pamphlets that went into several editions. When they were scholars, they were not usually in the first rank. They were the popularizers. From the point of view of the history of the church and of culture they occupy a position comparable to that of the friars of the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries. A study of the work of these 'middlemen' waits to be made. The manuscript letters will often reveal their relationships with the men of the first rank whose views they were disseminating; and their writings, equally, will reveal the adjustments they made in accommodating those views to the minds of those for whom they wrote. In the end the opinions in the heads of half the churchgoers were their opinions. It was their opponents' purpose to fill the heads of the other half. It would be somewhat invidious to mention names. It is the object of the hand list of authors and of the appendices to this monograph to allow the names to be remembered and their relative importance to be seen.

#### *Bibliography*

It was noticed, although unfortunately no record was kept of the fact, that many of the pamphlets had either a special supplement put out by the publisher, or else a final page, listing other publications of the same publishing house or author. Any one desiring to make a bibliography would find some hundreds of such aids, if not a few thousand, among the pamphlets.

## CONCLUSION

The question naturally arises as to how representative is this Pusey House collection. Short of a complete bibliography of the nineteenth century, there is no final means for judging. However, the incidence of duplicates between the various sub-collections gives some indication. It would seem that the leading controversies are already fully covered so far as their central documents are concerned. The most one can look for there is the appearance of another edition or some valuable marginalia. But outside these it seems that even the smallest accession to the pamphlet library will bring with it *some* useful additions along with the inevitable duplicates. It is hoped that as time goes on further accessions will increase the usefulness of the collection, but it seems unlikely, on the other hand, that stagnation will ever be reached.

## AUTHORS INDEX

NOTE: The following alphabetical lists give the names of all authors or addressees in the Pusey House pamphlet collection up to serial numbers 74232 and 14297 inclusive.

The lists are divided into sub-lists: Individuals; Anonyms and Pseudonyms; Corporate Bodies; Authors of marginalia and manuscript material within the pamphlet collection; and Periodicals.

Opposite each name is an indication of the number of entries on that particular author's card, e.g. 25/17 means 25 entries on the face of the card (i.e. pamphlets, etc. initiated or sponsored by the author) and 17 on the back (i.e. pamphlets addressed to the author or referring to him in the title). If /1 stands opposite a name, it signifies that there is only one entry on the author's card and is to be found on the back. If nothing stands opposite a name, it signifies that there is only one entry on the author's card, which is to be found on the face.

Names in these lists are taken direct from the pamphlets, which are not careful to record on every occasion enough information to prevent one name in the list from covering two distinct authors. Nor is it possible to say that each author appears only once in each list. He may appear under his initials, his surname and initials, his surname and christian names, his rank, his title, his appointment, or even under a pseudonym. A few cross-references have been made by the compiler, but caution and judgment will have to be exercised in isolating all and only the material relating to any one man.
