Bishops of the Diocese of New York



1. Samuel Provoost, bishop 1787–1815; resigned 1801. Born New York City 1742, died New York City, 1815.
2. Benjamin Moore, consecrated 1801 to serve in place of Samuel Provoost, resigned; became diocesan at the death of Provoost in 1815. Born Newtown, Long Island, 1748, died New York City, 1816.
3. John Henry Hobart, consecrated 1811 to serve in place of the disabled Bishop Moore; became diocesan 1816. Born Philadelphia, 1775; died Auburn, New York, 1830.
4. Benjamin Treadwell Onderdonk, Bishop of New York 1830–1861 (suspended 1845–1861). Born in New York City, 1791; died New York City, 1861.
5. Jonathan Mayhew Wainwright, consecrated 1852 to serve as Provisional Bishop in place of Bishop Onderdonk. Born in England, 1792; died in New York City, 1854.
6. Horatio Potter, consecrated 1854 to serve as Provisional Bishop in place of Bishop Onderdonk; became diocesan in 1861 at death of Bishop Onderdonk. Born LaGrange, New York, 1815; died New York City, 1887.
7. Henry Codman Potter, Acting Bishop 1883–1887 in place of Horatio Potter, his uncle; Bishop of New York 1887–1908. Born Schenectady, N.Y., 1834; died Cooperstown, N.Y., 1908.
8. David Hummell Greer, Bishop Coadjutor 1903–1908, Bishop of New York 1908–1919. Born Wheeling, [West] Virginia, 1844; died New York City, 1919.
9. Charles Sumner Burch, Bishop Suffragan 1911–1919; Bishop of New York 1919–1920. Born 1855 in Michigan; died New York City, 1920.
10. William Thomas Manning, Bishop of New York 1921–1946. Born Northampton, England, 1866; died New York City, 1949.
11. Charles Kendall Gilbert, Suffragan Bishop 1930–1947, Bishop of New York 1947–1950. Born Bainbridge, N.Y., 1878; died New York City, 1959.
12. Horace William Baden Donegan, Suffragan Bishop 1947–1949, Bishop Co-

adjutor, 1949–1950; Bishop of New York 1950–1972. Born Derbyshire, England, 1900.

13. Paul Moore, Jr., Bishop Coadjutor 1970–1972, Bishop of New York 1972–. Born Morristown, New Jersey, 1919.

Appendix II

Assisting Bishops of the Diocese



1. Benjamin Moore was elected in 1801 to act for Samuel Provoost, resigned; he subsequently became second Bishop of New York.
2. John Henry Hobart was elected to act for the invalid Benjamin Moore, and succeeded him in 1816 as third Bishop of New York.
3. Jonathan M. Wainwright was consecrated Provisional Bishop in 1852 to act in place of Benjamin T. Onderdonk, suspended.
4. Horatio Potter was elected Provisional Bishop in 1855 to act in place of Benjamin T. Onderdonk, and succeeded as sixth Bishop of New York at Bishop Onderdonk's death in 1861.
5. Henry Codman Potter was Bishop Coadjutor 1883–1887, and succeeded to become seventh Bishop of New York at the death of his uncle, Bishop Horatio Potter.
6. David Hummell Greer was Bishop Coadjutor 1903–1908, and succeeded Bishop Henry C. Potter in 1908 to become eighth Bishop of New York.
7. Charles Sumner Burch was elected Suffragan Bishop in 1911 after General Convention enacted a canon providing for suffragan bishops; he was elected ninth Bishop of New York upon Bishop Greer's death in 1919.
8. Arthur Seldon Lloyd, Suffragan Bishop of New York 1921–1936. Born Loudon County, Virginia, 1857; died Darien, Conn., 1936.
9. Herbert Shipman, Suffragan Bishop 1921–1930. Born Lexington, Kentucky, 1869; died New York City, 1930.
10. Charles Kendall Gilbert, Bishop Suffragan 1930–1947; elected eleventh Bishop of New York City, 1947.
11. Charles F. Boynton, Bishop Suffragan, 1951–1969. Born Geneseo, N.Y., 1906.
12. James Stuart Wetmore, Bishop Suffragan 1959–. Born 1913, Hampton, New Brunswick, Canada.
13. Harold Louis Wright, Bishop Suffragan 1974–1978. born Boston, Mass., 1929; died East Elmhurst, Queens, 1978.
14. Walter Decoster Dennis, Bishop Suffragan 1979–. Born Washington, D.C., 1932.

Appendix III

Members of the Standing Committee



In the diocesan conventions of 1785 and 1786 the delegates to General Convention probably assumed the responsibilities of what soon became the Standing Committee of the diocese. In the diocesan convention of June 1787, a committee was "appointed, with all power to call a special convention, should the episcopate become vacant by the death or removal of the Bishop." Thereafter, a Standing Committee became a fixed part of the structure of the Diocese of New York.
