Dear Parishioners of St Mary's:

The summer season is upon us and this is the last AVE until the October issue. You will note that the summer schedule is somewhat more normal this year than in the past. The daily Office of Morning and Evening Prayer will be said and there will be Evening Prayer and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, with a five-minute address, each Sunday evening at eight. The special devotions in time of war will, of course, be continued on Wednesdays and Fridays.

Vacation season is a time when we may bear special witness to our blessed Lord by placing Him and His Church first in all of our plans. Others will be drawn to our holy religion if it normally holds a prominent and glad part in our daily living.

The Trustees greatly regret that for financial reasons it will not be possible this year officially to reopen the Saint Mary's Summer Home at Keyport, New Jersey. However, the Home will be available to any parishioners who may care to use it at their own expense with the approval of the Rector in each case.

The clergy vacations voted by the Trustees are: July, Father Taber; August, Father Craven; September, Father Ward. Father Bruce is not officially on our clergy staff from June to October, but we shall hope to welcome him back again in the fall.

The list of Saint Mary's men and women in the armed forces of our country is printed in this issue of AVE. We gladly take the space to present this list which is truly the Saint Mary's Honor Roll. Such a list is greatly desired by our members of the armed forces and it may well remind their fellow parishioners that letters are always most welcome wherever our fighters are, from England to India and from the South Seas of the Pacific to Alaska. Above all, pray for them by name.

Will you not be as generous as possible in making special thank offerings for Saint Mary's needs at Corpus Christi, June the eighth, and on the Feast of Michaelmas, September the twentyninth? It is to be hoped that you will pay your pledges before leaving for any vacation in order that the Parish Treasurer may receive on time adequate amounts for the ordinary running expenses of the parish.

As always, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi will be observed at High Mass on the Sunday in the Octave, June the eleventh, when there will be a Procession of the Host, followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. This is one of the great festival services held in the course of the year at Saint Mary's.

May the summer season be filled with spiritual joy and wholesome recreation for each one of you!

THERE will be a Corporate Communion of the Servants of Christ the King at the nine o'clock Mass on Sunday, June the eleventh, followed by a communion breakfast in St Joseph's Hall.

The Church of St Mary the Virgin is supported largely by voluntary offerings through the use of weekly envelopes. Persons desiring the Duplex Envelopes for the support of the Parish and Missions are requested to apply to one of the clergy after High Mass or Evensong on Sundays, or to communicate with the Parish Secretary, Rector's Office, 145 West 46th Street.

SACRAMENTS AND OTHER RITES

- BAPTISMS.—Sundays after High Mass by arrangement with the clergy. Proper sponsors should be chosen.
- MARRIAGES are solemnized only after arrangement with the clergy and after three days' notice has been given. A certificate of Baptism should be produced by both parties. Those to be married should, if confirmed, receive Holy Communion. A nuptial Mass is suggested. It is against God's law to marry anyone divorced, as long as the other partner is living. Marriages are not solemnized during Lent, nor on Sundays or Christmas Day.
- SICK CALLS.—Holy Unction and Communion of the Sick, on application to the clergy, in person, by telephone, or by post.
- BURIALS.—The clergy should always be consulted *before* any arrangements are made. The bodies of baptized persons may be brought to the Chantry of the church at any time before the day of the funeral. It is the usual custom at St Mary's to have the funeral service a requiem Mass.
- MUSIC.—Arrangements for music at weddings or funerals should be made directly with Mr White, the Director of Music.
